In English, they wrote about their experiences during lockdown and focussed on time adverbials and past tense verbs. In Maths, they have revised and broadened their knowledge of place value and partitioning numbers up to 1000. They enjoyed French, recalling how to introduce themselves and how to count to 20. They also had time to learn to relax and stay grounded, during an introduction to mindfulness.

We decided to create our own version of the famous 'Hand prints' found in the Cueva de las Manos (Cave of Hands) in Argentina.
