From Autumn collections to sorting circles to reading 'A squash and a squeeze', this week has all been about what makes counting tricky or easy. The children have worked out for themselves that trying to count groups or piles doesn't give you the best results but lining

objects up means "you can see everything!" We have also introduced the '5-frame' and it did not take these bright sparks long to work out that they didn't need to count at all if every square had one object in, it was always going

to be 5! Looking forward to exploring patterns and number patterns next week! In RE, Milne class have been learning all about The Creation Story. We discovered what Christians believe about how God made the world and what animals he included. We wondered why God made Jellyfish and then had a go at making our own. The all look so wonderful and colourful - well done Milne!

Reiley, for working so hard in class at all times and making excellent choices. **William,** for achieving so much mathematically this week.


Lola, for producing such fabulously well-written work in English.



Year 4 Update

This week in Year 4, we have been very busy working on lots of the basics. We have spent some time thinking about strategies for working out times tables and thought about different ways to learn spellings.

In English we finished our stories based on the book Stone Age Boy. This gave us an opportunity to look at how we can edit work and be the teacher, correcting mistakes. The stories have been fun to read and you should have the opportunity to see them for yourselves before Parent Consultations in October.



Longfellow Class Update 'Meat-ing our Ancestors!'

Longfellow have been time travelling again this week to 'meat' some of our very distant ancestors. We headed back to the middle stone age, some 10,000 years ago, to find out what they might have eaten. We learnt that they would probably have used hunting and gathering techniques to collect food - hunting creatures that would have looked very different from the animals we know today. We learnt about some of their clever hunting strategies (like sneaking up on animals when they were

drinking in rivers or using trained dogs) and what weapons and tools they might have made to help them. Some of the plants, fruit and nuts that they may have collected can still be found today, and although our lives are very different today, we discovered that many of us still follow in their ancient footsteps by collecting blackberries and other fruits in modern Britain. We watched videos, read information and even hunted animals found around the class to widen our knowledge, then tried to put all that information into a mind map.

Blake Class Update

On Monday, as part of the Wokingham Children's Book Festival we welcomed, through the magic of MS Teams, the author Cath Howe to our classroom. She discussed her planning, writing and editing process (explaining that some chapters of her most recent book were the 40th draft!) and then set us a writing task based on a mystery object. Blake Class produced some top quality writing about a mysterious wooden chest.

PTA NEWS UPDATE


Hello all, and hope you had a good week.
