Donaldson Class News

This week, Year 1 pupils have been looking at 'part whole' models and started to develop an understanding of when two parts are added together it makes a whole. We used counters to explore different ways of partitioning a number and used 'Numicon' to find what the missing part could be in a part whole model. We also had lots of interesting discussions around whether it is possible for a part to be bigger than a whole, which children proved is not possible!

In English, we used mime to express the explorers' feelings and have written diary entries as though we were Scott.

In French, the children can now recall vocabulary to give details of the contents of their pencil case.

Year 4 News




Longfellow Class News (Year 5) 'Shady Dealings'










Blake Class News

<u>School Spending Requests/Projects</u> The following items/ideas have been agreed to be funded by the PTA:

- Donaldson would like bean bags for the reading area £60
- Art Project £225
- Reading books for older children which are dyslexia friendly £300

The following items/ideas are in discussion:

Miss Wheeler has requested a covered area outside Milne.

At the recent PTA meeting, we discussed the outside shelter area and possible alternative uses for this such as an outside PE covered area if extended?

We also discussed providing more tablets – for children to use and also to support possible virtual learning if required. Miss McGrail is going to provide costing for this.

The school would like to make improvements to the Library following on from Louise W and Gemma Moore sorting and clearing the old library books. Some new library books are now needed and Miss McGrail is going to provide costing for this.

The main, longer term project for the school is currently the School field project, which involves the field being cleared and secured with fencing (applying for a grant for fencing via safeguarding through DfE) and lots of planning! Ideally, there will be an all-weather running track around the field and sensory area among other ideas. Each aspect needs costing, and applications of grants to secure the funding in addition to PTA fundraising.

A general sort and clear out of the PTA shed is required!

We have a lot of second-hand school uniform in there. We plan to compile an inventory very soon to let parents know what is available. Unfortunately, due to COVID-19 restrictions we cannot do a uniform sale as we have in the past, but we are looking at other options, such as using Facebook.
