In order to ensure that learning is continued, irrespective of lockdown and self-isolation, St Nicholas Primary School has developed the following plan. This plan offers remote learning opportunities whilst also acknowledging that some households have limited access to devices and would require hard-copies of work and resources.

This plan will be applied in the following instances:

1. An individual is self-isolating because of a positive test within the household;
2. A group of children are self-isolating because of a case of coronavirus in the bubble;
3. A whole bubble or cohort is self-isolating because of an outbreak of coronavirus

The plan complies with the expectations and principles outlined in the DFE document [Guidance for Full Opening of Schools](#).

Software and online platforms

Within all plans, teachers will set appropriate work in-line with our current curriculum, primarily supplemented by a range of resources provided by Oak Academy and White Rose Maths.

Children will remain in contact with their Classteacher through MS Teams (after taught sessions).

Oak Academy has been selected to support remote learning for a number of reasons. The Oak Academy lessons are in-line with our teaching ethos – they encourage the use of retrieval practice, explicit teaching with high quality modelling, and the use of deliberate practice. The online lessons are free to all and offer a recorded taught session so that the children can access physical teaching from a teacher and then access work relating to that lesson within the same website. There are also hundreds of lessons specifically aimed at children with SEND needs and requiring additional support.

White Rose Maths resources will be used as they are matched to our current maths curriculum model. Children are very used to seeing these resources.

Numbots, and TT Rockstars will all be utilised to support the acquisition and retention of basic core skills.

Tapestry will be used to communicate and deliver online learning for EYFS pupils.

MS Teams will support school in offering true online learning with the opportunity for the children to communicate with their teacher through live video. This will be used so children can 'drop-in' to receive further support after accessing the Oak Academy resources.

In the event of any form of isolation and loss of learning caused by Coronavirus, parents must understand that engagement in home learning is compulsory, as is the expectation that St Nicholas Primary School makes that provision available and accessible to all. However, if children themselves are too ill to attend then they should not be expected to engage in home learning.

In preparation for home-learning, parents and children need to receive logins and passwords for the following platforms (likewise teaching staff need to be familiar with them):

- MS Teams (login provided with attached letter)
- TT Rockstars/Numbots (NB: these logins were provided on stickers at the start of term and are in your child's reading record or Year 6 homework diary)
- Should parents of EYFS pupils need assistance with their Tapestry login, please contact EYFS@st-nicholas.wokingham.sch.uk

Initial Plan (first two days)

An initial plan for the first two days of remote learning will be published on the class website page for KS1 or KS2 and on Tapestry for EYFS. This two day plan will allow staff time to plan remote learning linked to the school's curriculum expectations. It will provide learning across the curriculum and children will be expected to spend a similar amount of time completing this as they would spend learning in school.

The Two Day Plan will include:

They then select a lesson to complete; this includes a video and subsequent questions. Children have their own TTRockStars or Numbots login details to practice and rehearse their times-tables or number fact at the appropriate level.

Remote Learning (post two days)

Children who do not have access to the internet will have learning packs ready for collection at school. For all other children, the guidelines below will apply

Pupil needs to isolate because someone in their household is symptomatic or tests positive	
Ongoing Support	Safeguarding/SEND
<p>The Class teacher will email worksheets between 3pm-5pm using the class email address on the day before to allow parents to see the learning materials prior to supporting their child. The teacher will decide what materials are most appropriate for the individual child.</p> <p>For EYFS pupils, the class teacher will communicate via Tapestry and upload the phonics and maths lesson objectives for the period of absence. They will also provide direction to online resources to support those objectives.</p> <p>For KS1 and KS2 pupils no teaching input is required for core lessons. The teacher will direct the parent to a relevant Oak National or White Rose taught session. Non-core lessons and resources will be emailed to the individual child's parent.</p> <p>Should further support be required, the parent will email the class teacher to request further supporting materials and if necessary the class teacher will liaise with the parent by telephone.</p>	<p>School office to contact parents to ensure a test has been taken and to make sure that parents know to communicate test results to admin@st-nicholas.wokingham.sch.uk</p> <p>If a child is entitled to receive Free School Meals, vouchers will be issued to parents for the duration their child is unable to attend school.</p> <p>If a child is vulnerable in any way, the DSL [Designated Safeguarding Lead] will ensure that appropriate agencies are notified and arrange for regular wellbeing checks via a phone call</p> <p>If a child does not engage, the Classteacher is to call the parents to discuss obstacles and support.</p>

A whole bubble/cohort of children is isolating because of an outbreak of coronavirus	
Ongoing Support	Safeguarding/SEND
<p>The teacher will schedule a session or send a message as appropriate the following day to communicate expectations for the period of isolation. For KS1 and KS2 pupils, teachers will schedule a MS Teams meeting with children and parents. For EYFS pupils, the class teacher will use the Tapestry app.</p> <p>In this meeting or message, the teacher will discuss the remote learning arrangements and expectations. EYFS, KS1 and KS2 teachers will also share a timetable of learning – this will consist of phonics (letters, sounds, reading and writing) and maths for EYFS pupils.</p> <p>For KS1 a phonics provision will be made. This may consist of live group sessions or links to appropriate resources. For KS1 and KS2, core subject lessons (via White Rose Maths or Oak National Academy), an whole class meeting and a non-core lesson (via Oak National Academy or MS Teams) will be provided.</p> <p>For KS1 and KS2 the Class teacher will share links to appropriate lessons from White Rose Maths or Oak National Academy lessons via a weekly timetable sheet on a pdf. Teachers and Teaching Assistants will then be accessible to children through a scheduled drop-in slot on Teams so that any issues or re-teaching can be delivered live. For EYFS, a scheduled drop-in slot will provided via Tapestry.</p> <p>Time will also be scheduled for the children to watch a celebration assembly delivered by Miss McGrail. This will encourage children to keep working, celebrate successes and promote a togetherness.</p> <p>In EYFS, KS1 and KS2 teachers’ scheduled non-contact [PPA] time will be covered by either Teachers or Teaching Assistants in the phase who will deliver an afternoon non-core lesson and a reading for pleasure session at the end of the day.</p> <p>In the event of teachers becoming ill, another member of staff will provide appropriate provision.</p>	<p>Parents notified so they know to communicate test results to admin@st-nicholas.wokingham.sch.uk</p> <p>If a child is entitled to receive Free School Meals, vouchers will be issued to parents for the duration their child is unable to attend school.</p> <p>If a child is vulnerable in any way, the DSL [Designated Safeguarding Lead] will ensure that appropriate agencies are notified and arrange for regular wellbeing checks via a phone call</p> <p>Those not engaging with home learning are to receive a phone call from a member of SLT to discuss the obstacles and the support needed by the family. This will be followed up as appropriate.</p> <p>Where children would normally receive additional support from SEND agencies, the SENDCO will make arrangements for those to continue via Teams as long as the agencies engage.</p> <p>The SENDCO will share appropriate Oak National Academy SEND lessons with teachers who will disseminate accordingly.</p>

Completed work

It is important that your child’s work and effort is recognised. To share work, the class teacher will either request that a completed task is photographed and emailed to the class email address or the ‘turn in assignment’ functionality on MS Teams. It will be clear when the task is set which method they wish to be used.

Regarding White Rose materials, where answers are accessible, children will be directed to self-mark (where age appropriate) prior to submitting the completed task. Teachers can then review the work completed and ensure that the following day’s lesson addresses misconceptions etc. Feedback and queries can take place throughout the day using either Teams or class email, depending on the teacher’s preference. Those children who require additional support following feedback are to be directed to a Teams meeting with attendance expected.
