On Friday last week, we were notified by a resident that one of the horses, Hurley, in the field adjacent to the Village Hall was in significant distress. We have since had an update from its owner that Hurley was in fact choking on something that a passer-by had given him to eat. The vet was urgently called to assist, and was eventually able to dislodge the blockage from Hurley's throat, which is a very painful and dangerous procedure. Hurley is now in recovery and been prescribed a course of antibiotics. Signage has now been placed along the fence to remind people not to feed the horses – that although it may seem harmless, your kindness may kill. We would appreciate everyone's vigilance to ensure Hurley and William's continued safety.

The children then created a playdough friend for Beegu and will shortly write a character description of their friend. The class really wants to know what happens to Beegu, but we
