Pupil Premium

At St Nicholas Primary School Primary School we support all our pupils. We do this by providing high quality classroom teaching, supplemented by interventions to support vulnerable learners as and when required.

We consider the individual needs of pupils when looking at and planning the type of provision required. For the academic year 2019/2020, the table below highlights the areas of need and the strategies we are using to raise achievement.

All the pupils will achieve a good level of development at the end of their time in foundation stage. Outcomes for pupils in receipt of the premium will be at least in line with pupils in other schools nationally, who didn't receive funding. All Pupils – pupils will be meeting or exceeding age related expectations by the end of the academic year. For those pupils working below age related expectations progress is indicating that the gap between them and their peers is narrowing.
