<u>Library/Reading Project</u> – The PTA have agreed to spend £2,000 on Accelerated Reader. For information about this, please see below which Mrs Holland presented in the recent PTA meeting:

'A target on our school development plan this academic year is "improve progress data from end of KS1 to end of KS2 in reading and writing".

To this end, I spoke at the PTA meeting last week about an initiative we are planning to introduce for Key Stage 2 in the early Spring Term - Accelerated Reader - and to ask for funding support.

As you are aware, the reading ability of pupils has a considerable impact on how well they can access the whole curriculum.

Accelerated Reader is a computer program that helps teachers manage and monitor children's independent reading practice. A pupil picks a book at his/her own level and reads it at his/her own pace. When finished, they take a short quiz on the computer - passing the quiz is an indication that the child has understood what has been read. The absolute key here is the understanding – the pupil may be able to physically read the words of almost any book out loud but the quizzes test the understanding/comprehension of the chosen text. Accelerated Reader gives both children and teachers feedback based on the quiz results which the teacher then uses to help the pupil set targets.

Each classroom will have at least one laptop set up so that the pupils can regularly take quizzes based on books as they read them. Accelerated Reader can also be accessed from home.

Classes have already started to reorganise and replenish their book shelves (via Amazon wishlists, donation of second hand books, fundraising etc) with books of the appropriate reading and interest levels. We are committed to ensuring the best start to this programme and are confident that it will have a significant positive impact on pupil reading and writing.

Following the PTA meeting, (and considerable negotiation on my part with the salesperson representing Accelerated Reader!), the PTA have agreed to fund the first year's subscription, which includes a comprehensive training package for staff and resources needed to successfully establish Accelerated Reader in school for the next 15 months.

Once relevant staff have undergone training, we will hold information sharing sessions with parents about the scheme.
