We are pleased to announce that we have confirmed plans for a wraparound care provision (breakfast and after school club) which will officially open after the Easter break from 19th April BA SPORTS 2021. This service will be run by an external provider, BA Sports www.basportstar.co.uk and offer a range of activities including active play, crafts, board games etc. BA Sports have run many clubs at our school over the past year and currently run several activity and wraparound care clubs in and around the area. We are still finalising the finer details of the service and we will continue to keep parents updated; there is now a dedicated page on our website to facilitate this.
