Harley's First Race!

On Wednesday last week, Harley in Blake class rode in a Cyclocross race in the Sprockets SummerCX at Dinton Pastures. Using the skills he gained during our school cycle sessions, Harley was one of almost 100 riders under 12 years who raced around Dinton Pastures on a hot summer evening. For people new to cycle-sport, Cyclocross is like Parkrun on a bike and is a number of laps around a grass and gravel course with frequent twists and turns. You ride as many laps as you can in 10 minutes and the time is recorded Grand-Prix style with an electronic timing chip around your ankle. If you want to give it a go, there is one more race on 30th June and anyone age 3 or older can enter (parents too): Sign on is at 5pm and the U10 and U12 races are over around 6pm. https://my.raceresult.com/170584/ (30 June 2021)



Longfellow Music Lessons

Every Monday afternoon since the start of the summer term, Longfellow class have been participating in music lessons with Berkshire Maestros on percussion instruments. We started off with some basic patterns on the drums and glockenspiel and progressed to playing songs such as *Dance Monkey* and *Three Lions*. In one Friday assembly, we even played the drums on different surfaces to create an ensemble. We have all largely improved on our musical ability during these lessons and have worked very hard but it is definitely worth it. We were taught by Ellie, a teacher at Berkshire Maestros who has helped us greatly in learning all about music notes like crotchets and minims and we also studied the notes on the glockenspiel such as C# and D. We then played around with the notes to create our own patterns and had a go at playing them on the glockenspiel. We have had a lot of fun during these music lessons and we are very disappointed that they are nearing an end.

Year 6 First Aid Workshop

On Monday 21st June, Claire Street, a first aid trainer from *Child Matters*, visited Blake class to teach us about how to deal with casualties. We started by doing CPR on dummies. We learnt the importance of assessing the situation before acting on it, in case we are also putting ourselves in danger. After that, we learnt about defibrillators in case the casualty needed more than CPR, and where to find them around the village. When we learnt about treating burns, Claire recommended wrapping cling film around it to reduce the amount of oxygen to the wound.

We then learnt about bandages and practised on the arm of our partner, and theoretically tried to keep their blood flowing. Then, Claire gave each pair a 'training' Epipen, without the needle and adrenaline. It was very interesting to see how they work. Claire also taught us how to clear someone's airways and keep them alive in the event that they stop breathing. We were fascinated on how much we could do to keep a person alive if they were ever in serious trouble. We are so lucky to have had this opportunity; we all learnt something, whilst having a great time.


