Staffing Update – Interim Deputy Headteacher

As you know, Mrs Amy Holland is currently on maternity leave following the birth of her daughter, Daisy. I am pleased to inform you that the interim role of Deputy Headteacher will be filled by Mrs Sarah Hilling on a part-time fixed-term basis. During her time at St Nicholas school, first as a Year 1 teacher and now as Special Needs coordinator, Mrs Hilling has demonstrated strong commitment to supporting the ethos and values of the school. She has built excellent relationships with the pupils, parents and families and developed outstanding working relationships with all staff. I am delighted she is able to work with me, the staff and governors to continue with our mission – to build a firm foundation for all pupils.

In addition, Mrs Gia Middleton and Mr Andy Butler-Willis have been appointed to the role of KS1 and KS2 Coordinator respectively. The senior leadership team comprising of Miss McGrail, Mrs Hilling, Mrs Middleton and Mr Butler-Willis will be focussed on continued curriculum development and raising standards of reading, writing and maths across the school.

SAFER Online Safety - Urgent Parent Update

We know a lot of our children are lucky enough to have access to online programme channels such as Netflix or Amazon. Sadly, this week, we have heard a few children talking about the new Netflix series 'Squid Game', which is a **certificate 15 programme and totally unsuitable for primary age children.** Please read the <u>National Online Safety's guide</u> to the risks for children with regards to Squid Game.

If your child has access to online TV and YouTube, we strongly advise you to add parental controls. We have attached an info sheet on how you set up parental controls on Netflix accounts. Also please be mindful if older siblings have devices and how they might be sharing these. We advise all devices are kept in family, shared rooms, so you can monitor how long they are on the devices and what they are watching. We are aware that versions of Squid Game are available in games such as Roblox, Minecraft and Fortnite, so even if children haven't seen the programme, they are being exposed to the same themes via these games.

Tape Lane – Restricted Access

The number of vehicles using Tape Lane has increased at school drop-off and pick-up times which is creating an unsafe situation, potentially putting pupil safety at risk. Tape Lane has restricted access and is a designated 'Safer Walking Route to School' as pedestrians and cyclists are encouraged to use the lane. Please can parents refrain from driving into Tape Lane for the purpose of dropping children close to school. Our children's safety is of utmost importance. The situation is being monitored and Police will be carrying out enforcement checks that could lead to drivers receiving fines and/or penalty points as a consequence for infringing the restriction in place in Tape Lane.
