Crisp Packet Blankets - Using waste to help those in need

Celebrating Lunar New Year - Tuesday 1st February



Lunar New Year falls this year on Tuesday 1st February, starting a year of the Tiger. It marks the beginning of the Spring Festival holiday which is the biggest holiday in the Chinese calendar. Hong Kong's New Year festival is world-famous and in Hong Kong, people mark the occasion with a unique fusion of modern fun and ancient customs. The three days public holiday from 1st - 3rd February includes a night parade and spectacular fireworks. Information about the celebration of Lunar New Year in Hong Kong, their traditions, art and music can be found here. Celebrations traditionally last for 16 days, starting from Chinese/Lunar New Year's Eve (31st January 2022) to the Lantern Festival (on the 15th
