Dear Parents and Carers

They say that time flies when you're having fun; we are already reaching the end of the third week back since half term. We have seen some exciting sporting events with hockey, multi sports and football tournaments; more on this within this newsletter edition. EYFS and KS1 children are looking forward to their multi-skills afternoon at the Forest School Air Dome and 'Perform' drama workshops. Blake Class spent a day with Alex Baker, leader of 'Igniting Writing', a creative writing club for 11-18 year olds held at Wokingham Library. Alex shared his enthusiasm for writing and writing technique. We look forward to the children sharing their own imaginative story writing skills following this event.

A polite reminder about School PE kit; please ensure that children have a school branded polo shirt, plain blue or black tracksuit bottoms or shorts and a school branded jumper. We are also seeing an increase in the number of unnamed items of uniform, please check all uniform is clearly named. We have quite a pile of lost property which will be displayed on tables in the playground tomorrow after school.

With Spring officially in full swing, we are delighted that Milne will be heading over to the allotment next Tuesday for a Spring treasure hunt. In addition to that, Rachel Jarvis will return to run gardening sessions for Year 3 pupils starting 29th March, in order to prepare the raised beds ready to begin planting after Easter.

Following a discussion with staff there will no longer be a requirement for KS2 children to hold a "licence" for a blue handwriting pen. Instead, children will be rewarded for care and effort over their work, improved presentation and handwriting, by their class teacher. Children in TS Eliot class will be allocated a blue handwriting pen (named) that children will be expected to respect and look after. Subsequent replacement pens will continue to be provided for a 25p donation.

PTA UPDATE



PTA Quiz Night - Friday 29th April

Since the last newsletter we have begun to confirm arrangements for this event. Tickets will cost £16 each, to include a Mexican style meal. The main dishes will be gluten and dairy free and efforts will be made to cater for any other dietary requirements. We will have a bar which will be selling cocktails created by the school's own qualified mixologist along with beer and wine. Tickets will go on sale very soon, get your teams together to avoid disappointment!

We are also going to need a team of people to help make this event happen. We need volunteers to help behind the bar, sell tickets, sort out a raffle and also set up and put away afterwards. Can you spare a little time to help us out?

Fundraising Requests

You hear us bang on about wanting to raise money, but must wonder where it all goes.

Rachel Jarvis, our green fingered gardening volunteer is resuming gardening sessions on the raised beds with Year 3 pupils on Tuesday afternoons, starting on 29th March until the end of the academic year. The PTA has agreed a budget of £100 for seeds, equipment and other materials that are needed for the children.

With the new investment in the Accelerated Reader books and with the upcoming new Phonics Scheme in line with Government approved schemes, there is a need to improve upon the currently limited library storage options. The plan is to organise a library area for reading books for the whole school which is more accessible for all. The PTA has agreed to fund £500 for the project.

PTA Future

At the moment there are five people who form the PTA committee, and to be honest we are struggling to do a good job because we all work full time and several of us have other voluntary roles too. We have advertised for help with the role of secretary and nobody has come forward.

The money we raise goes to the benefit of all our children, be it in the form of paying for a science teacher, buying new books or IT equipment, or money towards the maintenance of the school grounds in which our children play. I realise that everyone is busy these days but if you would be able to give a small amount of time, maybe just an hour a week to help write a newsletter or a few hours each term to minute the PTA meetings, or be part of the discussion around what we do, it would make a huge difference. We are very open to any suggestions and new ideas, please help lighten the load. We desperately need your help.
