Cycling Sessions for Years 3-6 from Wednesday 8th June



Coach Lloyd will be returning to St Nicholas to run cycling sessions for all KS2 pupils on Wednesdays after half term. The first session will commence on Wednesday 8th June. Year 6 will have a morning session, while Years 3, 4 and 5 will cycle after lunch in the afternoon. Your child will need a bicycle with two working brakes and a helmet and bring both to school each Wednesday. The cycle sessions will take place in all weather conditions so we ask that appropriate PE clothing is worn each week and there will be

no need to send a change of clothes. Children can arrive in PE kit and stay in PE kit for the day. There are currently four spare school bikes available if your child does not currently own one.

WW2 Workshop

This week, Longfellow and TS Eliot were sent back in time to World War II. They were visited by Mr Parsons, who was dressed as an air-raid warden (ARP). They looked at what people would have worn when they went to war and what items they took with them. They also experienced how an air-raid siren would have sounded (very loud!) and what gas masks were like and who would have worn them. Near the end of the day, they learnt to save someone if their house had been bombed using special bandages that were tied around the injured person's feet.

Mr Parsons, a WWII expert, showed us the difference between a child's gas mask and an adult's. A child's mask was called 'Mickey Mouse' to encourage children to wear it. Mr Parsons told us a story of the Pied Piper, which is also the name of the evacuation that started in 1939 before the actual war had started.
