PRIMARY school children have received jubilee mugs which will remind them of the fun they had at the Queen's 70th anniversary celebrations.

Pupils at St Nicholas Primary in Hurst were presented with the mugs by Paul Palmer of Hurst Parish Council last Friday.

Paul, who still has his own Queen's 25th jubilee mug, was a pupil at St Nicholas at the time of the silver anniversary.

The presentations were made at the school's jubilee celebrations last Friday.



Olly has been involved in Judo for 20+ years and coaching for 11 years and is a UK CC Level 2 Qualified coach. He is affiliated with the British Judo Association and guest coach at the Pinewood Judo Club in Crowthorne. Judo club will be open to pupils in Years 2-6 only.

On **Friday 17**th **June**, Olly will be visiting St Nicholas to run a taster session in during the school day (for pupils in Year 1 and above) to give the children an opportunity to meet Olly and get a flavour of the sport before committing to booking lessons. Children will need to wear their PE kit on Friday 17th June.
