Sayers Croft Year 4 Residential

In late June, Year 4 pupils went on a three-day residential trip to Sayers Croft activity centre in Surrey. Everyone was beyond excited – no wonder the outward coach journey on Monday morning was so loud.

Our first activity was orienteering – like a treasure hunt. Next, we did shelter building, using only logs to keep it stable and tarpaulin to make it waterproof. Everyone had a great time even though no one stayed entirely dry. The campfire that night was very exciting, especially toasting marshmallows. Aside from eating s'mores we played some fun games and – led by DJ BW - sang songs. A perfect end to our day!

After a cooked breakfast, we were split into groups for woodland ropes and caving. The woodland ropes included a climbing wall, a rope bridge, a zip line and many more obstacles! In the caves, it was very dark and slightly scary. It had twists, turns and vertical drops, and everyone was very brave, including Mrs Mitchell!

That evening, we did a blindfold trail and a maze challenge. The maze was very hard due to the fact that you had to crack a code using letters on the way. On the blindfold trail you had no idea what you were standing on, which gave me, in particular, a very strange sensation.

We also did a stream walk. The water was quite cold and brown, coloured by the clay banks. I, and a few others, put on clay war paint! The final morning, we did a wooden compass trail, where you had to collect clues and do a loop through the woods. Our final activity on the trip was pond-dipping. The things people caught included small fish, tadpoles, dragonfly nymphs, water snails and pond-skaters.



End of Year KS2 Performance 'Panto Pandemonium'

On Tuesday evening, KS2 pupils performed an amazing play called 'Panto Pandemonium'. Even though we only had three weeks to rehearse, we managed to pull off an incredible play with lighting, scenery and a great bunch of actors! Even with the challenges they face, the school children still manage to get the three magic objects back to the good fairy before the witch could ruin the pantomime.
