# **Attendance**

St Nicholas School believes that punctual and regular school attendance is essential for effective learning.

We are committed to ensuring that all students attend school regularly and where possible have an attendance of above



96% for the academic year. Regular school attendance is vital if students are to benefit from the experiences which the school offers them; we believe that students should attend school regularly to give them the best opportunity to learn and grow.

Our vision states that we are building firm foundations for our children. Poor attendance makes this increasingly challenging, compromising these foundations meaning children and teachers have to work even harder to make up missed time.

Our teachers are ready to start their first lesson at 9.00am, and our teaching assistants are already listening to readers and working with small groups from 8.35am.

#### Why is attendance so important?

It is difficult to "catch up" when time is missed. Even starting the day late can impact your child's entire day and effects learning in the classroom.

Your child will feel connected academically and socially when they have good attendance.

Good school attendance helps to build habits that last a lifetime and transfer beyond school.

0 days off school in a year 0 lessons missed	100%	Perfect attendance
2 days off school in a year 10 lessons missed	99%	Excellent attendance
5 days off school in a year 25 lessons missed	97%	Good attendance
10 days off school in a year 50 lessons missed	95%	Slightly below average attendance
14 days off school in a year 70 lessons missed	93%	Poor attendance
20 days off school in a year 100 lessons missed	90%	Very poor attendance

#### Reporting Absence

Whilst attendance is key to learning it is also important that when your child is ill they have time off to rest and get better. Please telephone the school office before 8.45am if your child is going to be absent. This should be done on the first and every day of their absence. #### **Bikeability sessions during February Half Term**

Avanti Cycling will be running some sessions at a few locations during February Half Term. These are for parents and children who can already ride a bike confidently (not complete beginners). ### New Year, new challenge, new hobby?



In May 2023, King Charles III will be crowned. Ringing the church bells of Hurst will be an act of very public celebration for an event of historic significance which we are very much looking forward to. We have a challenge to make sure we have enough ringers and we are looking for new recruits to help meet it.


Bell ringing in English style dates back to the 16th century, and the bells at Hurst were first installed in the early 17th century during a period of significant growth for bell founders and bell ringers in England. There are around 5000 churches with bells hung for

ringing in the UK, meaning that there are few corners of this land where the sound of bells cannot be heard. This has helped shape the soundscape that we associate with quintessential England, whether in city, town or country village.

Hurst's bells are kept ringing today for church services, for weddings, for public celebrations and commemorations, and sometimes just for ringer's entertainment. It requires a team of people to do this, because ringing is not a solo performance. We enjoy the opportunity to engage in a unique pastime which helps keep our minds and bodies active whilst promoting friendships and social interaction with people of a wide age range and backgrounds. It is an activity that is well suited to family participation, and there are plenty of examples of multiple generations becoming involved.

Learning the basics to ring church bells safely can be undertaken in around 10 hours of tuition, mostly on a one-to-one basis with an experienced tutor on a tied bell (bell is silent). Thereafter, practice is required to ring a bell proficiently with others in the band and can take a few weeks up to a few months to confidently ring for public performance. As experience and skill is increased, there are more facets to be discovered in the world of bell ringing, and for many it becomes a life-long hobby.

If you think you might be interested in coming to find out more and would like to consider our call to arms to ring for the King's coronation in May, then now is the time to start. It is often found helpful to learn in a small group of 2 or 3, so why not grab a friend and come together. Alternatively, perhaps your Mum or Dad, or your son or daughter, might be interested to learn as a shared family activity?
