Dear Parents and Carers,

It is incredible to think that we are now starting the second half of our academic year. It is really exciting to see how our curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have grown and this has been reflected in fantastic progress the children have made.

I also want to bring your attention to the changes we have made in our approach to the teaching of reading. Reading has been a key area of focus across the school; ensuring that we lay the foundations for our children with a robust phonics offer in the early years before supporting their development as fluent readers who can access and progress through the curriculum. All children have reading lessons daily across the school and we aim to instill an enjoyment of reading which will stay with the children into adulthood.

We are currently raising funds so we can continue to build our reading library and the books on offer to ensure that all children have age appropriate books at the level they can access. We hope in the near future, to raise £2500 to bridge the gap between Little Wandle and Accelerated Reader.

On Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> March, we will be holding a phonics and reading information morning for parents, carers, our school visitors and governors. We will have refreshments on offer to enable guests to have time to talk to staff and ask questions. More information will follow.

**STORYTIME**: Teachers will be moving around to read to the children extracts from their favourite books. There will be hot chocolate and biscuits on offer!




