## **Museum Trip**

On Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> May, TS Eliot and Longfellow went on an interesting trip to The Museum of English Rural Life (MERL).

We learnt about the experience of life in the countryside thanks to the help of Barbara Wood, who was evacuated during World War II with her sister, Betty. She was evacuated from Bristol when a bomb exploded in their shed and the family decided it wasn't safe there anymore. I was fascinated to learn about rationing, although my favourite part was in MERL's garden where we made brass rubbings. I can't wait to go back again.

### Poppy, Year 3

We learnt from a 92-year-old, who was an evacuee from WWII, that some children were excited to be evacuated but some children weren't. We learnt that you could get a vegetarian ration book which was a surprise to me. In the afternoon, we explored the museum. We also go to handle some WWII objects such as shoes, water jugs and clothes.

### Primrose, Year 4

We saw olden day things and new day things. It was amazing! We saw wagons and cook books and there were even little mice poking up everywhere! The lady we met talked about where she lived and where she was evacuated to. She travelled by train with her sister to the countryside from Bristol. There were lots of activities and it was so exciting.



#### Help on the day


Before half term you will receive a link via your class rep where you can sign up to helping on the stall for one hour slots. Remember we can't do this without your support.
