Attendance

St Nicholas School believes that punctual and regular school attendance is essential for effective learning. We celebrated excellent attendance last academic year where we ended the year with 95.4%. We are committed to aiming for 97% attendance for all our children.



We are committed to ensuring that all students attend school regularly and have an attendance of above 97% for the academic year. Regular school attendance is vital if students are to benefit from the experiences which the school offers them; we believe that students should attend school regularly because this is where they learn and this is where they grow.

Our vision states that we are laying firm foundations for our children. Poor attendance makes this increasingly challenging and therefore the foundations are compromised and children and teachers have to work even harder to make up missed time.

Our teachers are ready to start their first lesson at 9.00am and our teaching assistants are already listening to readers and working with small groups from 8.35am.

Why is attendance so important?

Lessons are sequential, building one on the other, making it difficult to "catch up" when time is missed. Even starting the day late can impact your child's entire day and affect learning in the classroom.

Your child will feel connected academically and socially when they have good attendance.


Good school attendance helps to build habits that last a lifetime and transfer beyond school.

Please note that family holidays in term time are not authorised. We are in school for 190 days over the year, which leaves 175 days in which to take authorised holidays. We expect all routine medical appointments to be made during holidays, weekends and after school, where possible.

If you need to take your child out of school, please complete a form which can be obtained from the office. Only the Head of School has the discretion to grant absence from school in very exceptional circumstances.

20 days off school in a year 100 lessons missed	90%	Very poor attendance



WATER SAFETY PARTNERSHIP






Did you know that every year, in the UK, around 400 people die from drowning as a result of an accident in or around water?

Drowning is the third most common cause of accidental death in children, (NWSF, WAID 2018).

It's really important that children, from a young age, should be taught the dangers they may encounter around water. Not only in their home such as paddling pools and ponds, but also when out and about, such as at the swimming pool, near rivers, canals and the sea.

The Water Safety Partnership is a joint partnership with Thames Valley Police and Royal Berkshire Fire and Rescue Service to try to prevent as many water based fatalities and injuries as we can.
